



Project: Tangará da Serra

Overview:

Tangara da Serra is a city of sixty thousand inhabitants located approximately 150 miles from Cuiabá, the capitol of the state of Mato Grosso. This state borders Paraguay. It is a sort of “western frontier” that has developed rapidly in the last thirty years as it was opened to agriculture, cattle raising, and mining. This region is famous for its ecosystem and receives thousands of international tourists who are interested in its extensive swamps and wildlife and fisheries.

Project Summary

This mission project needs assistance in the completion of the church and the construction of a parsonage.

Project Needs

This project has the support of the Conference and the church is advanced in its construction. What is needed is finishing work and the purchase of materials that cost approximately \$5,000. The parsonage is in the initial stages of development and would involve an investment of \$14,000 and the involvement of various work teams.

Logistics

International travel to Tangara da Serra would be via Sao Paulo and a connecting flight into Cuiaba. From there travel to the mission project would be by vans.

This area has a number of very interesting ecotourist sites that are world-renowned. The Pantanal swamp is the largest in the world and has a wide variety of birds, fish and other animals. In addition, there are a number of other interesting natural sites to see in the area.
